- together the **Community Plan for Sevenoaks District**

Making it happen – together is the Community Plan for the Sevenoaks District. It sets out a 10 year vision statement that reflects what local people have told us is important to them and the area.

This annual report summarises progress and achievements made during 2007/08

The themes in the Community Plan were identified following extensive consultation with the community and partners agencies as follows:

We want Sevenoaks District to be recognised by all as a place with:

- **Safe and Caring Communities**
- **A Green and Healthy Environment**
- **A Dynamic and Sustainable Economy**

These themes are supported by a the **Sevenoaks District Sustainable Community Action Plan 2007-2010**, a three-year action plan which contains 122 targets. It identifies timescales and lead agencies responsible for delivering and monitoring each action.

At the end of the first year of the new three year action plan 93% of the 122 targets were achieved or on target to be achieved.



The 2008 annual progress report making it happen

- together the **Community Plan for Sevenoaks District**

The Sevenoaks District Sustainable Community Action Plan is your community plan. It aims to improve the quality of life for everyone who lives, works and is educated in the District. It was drawn up following widespread consultation with local people, voluntary and community organisations and other public organisations.

The Local Strategic Partnership has been working hard to deliver the community's priorities and I am particularly pleased to note some real successes over the last year

Successes have included a reduction in crime levels and an increase in how safe people feel across the District. The roads are safer with a significant reduction in the number of people killed or sustaining serious injuries.

More young people than ever are participating in a variety of activities and have access to services aimed specifically at meeting their needs. Summer 2007 saw the highest ever number of recorded attendances at the Sevenoaks District Council's Youth Zone summer activities.

An incredible 11,100 people have benefited from healthy lifestyles activities in the District. These have included health walks, dance classes, mental health workshops and men's health events. There has also been an increase in the number of people supported to live independently in their own homes through Kent County Council's Active Care Scheme.

Untaxed and abandoned vehicles have been dealt with and New Air Quality Management Areas have been introduced.

According to the most recently available statistics, tourism in the District has contributed around £153 million to the local economy


which has directly benefited local businesses including hotels, cafes, shops and attractions in Sevenoaks.

There are some real challenges ahead for the Partnership not least of which is the key role the Partnership will play in helping to deliver the next three year Local Area Agreement between central government and Kent which will be called the Kent Partnership Agreement 2 (KA2).

The Sevenoaks District LSP is committed to delivering 35 agreed indicators across the eight themes of the KA2 which tie in closely with the themes of the Sustainable Community Action Plan. These are Economic Success; Learning for Everyone, Improved Health, Care and Wellbeing, Environmental Excellence, Stronger and Safer Communities, Enjoying Life, Keeping Kent moving and High Quality Homes.

Safe and Caring Communities

How did we do?

Our **Priority Outcome 1** is to reduce overall levels of recorded crime in the District by 5% by 2010

- Sevenoaks had the lowest crime in Kent in 2007/08. The number of crimes fell from 7268 in 2006/07 to 6189 in 2007/08. This represents a reduction of 1097 crimes or 15.1%. Between 2005/06 and 2007/08 there was a total reduction of 1759 crimes or 22.1%.

Our **Priority Outcome 2** is to increase the number of residents who feel safe by 3% by 2010 (1% year on year)

- In March 2008, 97% of respondents surveyed said they felt safe during the day and 94% felt safe at home alone during the night. The overall the number of people who felt safe in 2007/08 was 88% which represents an increase of 10% on 2006 figures.

Our **Priority Outcome 3** is to reduce the number of people killed or seriously injured on local roads in Sevenoaks District by 40% between 2000 and 2010

- There has been a 45% reduction in the number of people killed or seriously injured on local roads between 2000 and March 2008 which exceeds the target by 5%

Successes during 2007/08

- PACT (Partners and Communities Together) Panels have been set up in seven local communities with local people directly able to influence the priorities of the Police and other agencies in their areas.
- Swanley Police Station was opened as a fully functioning police station following West Kent Police becoming responsible for policing the whole of the Sevenoaks District.
- 57 people were referred to the Community Safety Partnership's Anti-Social Behaviour Task Group and 91% of showed an improvement over six months.
- 56.1% of respondents surveyed agreed that their local area was a place where people from different backgrounds and cultures get on well together. This represents an 11.8% increase on previous years figures.
- The Community Safety Partnership has carried out Environmental Visual Audits (EVA's) in Swanley and New Ash Green. An EVA is an assessment of a local area by partners and residents leading to an agreed action plan for improvements to the area.
- A Community Domestic Abuse Programme (CDAP) started in July 2007 for perpetrators of Domestic Abuse. Ten men have so far attended the 29 week programme.
- The use of CCTV, working with schemes such as the Safer Shopping Initiative, Pubwatch and Shopsafe, led 238 arrests during 2007/08.

What are the challenges ahead for 2008/09

- Delivering the new Sevenoaks District Community Safety Action Plan 2008-2011. The new action plan has three key themes to:
 - o Reduce and Detect Crime;
 - o Reduce anti-social behaviour and fear of crime ; and
 - o Strengthen community involvement
- Continuing to roll out a programme of PACT consultations across the District with a view to establishing further PACT panels.
- Supporting delivery of the targets within the Kent Partnership Agreement's Stronger and Safer Communities theme and Keeping Kent Moving theme.

Safe and Caring Communities

How did we do?

Our **Priority Outcome 4** is to deliver at least 70% of the Young People's Action Plan on target

- The Young People's Action Plan (YPAP) responds to issues identified by children and young people themselves. Its main themes are involvement, leisure and support. The Plan is monitored by young people and 100% of actions in the plan were on target during 2007/08.

Our **Priority Outcome 5** is to increase the number of people who are supported to live independently in their own homes

- Kent County Council provide a six week active care service for people leaving hospital following emergency admission. Active Care Service staff visit to agree a care plan designed to help the person to become as self-caring and independent as possible.
- In 2006/7 217 people were admitted to the Active Care service, with 108 self caring after six weeks. In 2007/8 302 people admitted and 166 were self caring

Our **Priority Outcome 6** is to increase the number of projects progressed in partnership by the Voluntary, Community, Faith and statutory organisations

- There were 14 projects progressed in partnership by voluntary, community, faith and statutory organisations during 2007/08.

Our **Priority Outcome 7** is to increase the number of volunteers in areas at risk of social exclusion by at least 6% and to enable 600 people in the District to access community projects

- There were 68 people registered as volunteers in areas at risk of social exclusion in 2007/08. This is an increase of 65% on 2005/06 figures.
- Nearly 17,000 people in the District have been enabled to access community projects. These have included Swanley Planning for Real, Gardening for Wildlife, healthy lifestyles initiatives, Partners and Communities Together (PACT), 8-12's projects, and attendance at the 2007 Summer Youth Zone Programmes.

Successes during 2007/08

- The extension of the 8-12's project has attracted new volunteers in Swanley, Sevenoaks and New Ash Green. This is partnership project between Sevenoaks District Council and West Kent Extra with support

from Town and Parish councils and benefits over 100 children per week.

- Between April and Sept 2007, partnership projects provided 268,052 young people's attendances across the District. This represents an increase of 20% compared to the same period in 2006.
- The Sevenoaks District Play Partnership successfully applied for £212k funding from the Big Lottery Fund Children's Play programme in 2007. Six free play projects are being developed; three of these in Westerham, Swanley and Edenbridge, are now complete.
- Sevenoaks District Council grant aided voluntary and community organisations providing 285,869 hours of voluntary activity in the District.
- A Young People's Housing Strategy was developed by the District Council.
- West Kent Extra launched its Rising Stars Bursary and during 2007/08 supported young people involved in a diverse range of activities and projects and awarded near £4,000 in funding.
- Sevenoaks District Council in partnership with Kent County Council and other Local Authorities, entered a Private Finance Initiative (PFI) project to provide 20 units of enhanced sheltered accommodation for the elderly.
- Kent Youth Service projects have continued with Snowboarding and Motorcross seeing over 45 young young across Hartley, New Ash Green, Swanley and Wildernesse School on diversionary projects.
- 151 disabled facilities grants to adapt properties were processed during 2007/08 exceeding the target by over 25%.
- Sevenoaks District has one of the lowest number of people in temporary accommodation/Bed and Breakfast in Kent.

What are the challenges ahead for 2008/09?

- Consultation with Children and Young People for the District's third Young People's Action Plan is now underway. This will be launched in March/April 2009.
- Supporting delivery of the targets within the Kent Partnership Agreement's Improved Health, Care and Wellbeing and Enjoying Life themes.
- Continuing to support people to be able to live independently in their own homes.

Our Green Environment Priorities:

- Maintain and improve the natural beauty and historic character of the District
- Maintain safe and clean environments
- Reduce pollution and damage to the environment

Green and Healthy Environment

How did we do?

Our **Priority Outcome 8** is to ensure appropriate policies and guidance are in place in the Local Development Framework (LDF) to maintain and improve the natural beauty and historic character of the District”

- The LDF Preferred Options Core Strategy will be ready for consultation in September 2008. It will set the vision and strategic objectives for future development in the District It will include issues such as landscape and heritage, biodiversity and the environment, design, the local economy, housing and local facilities, services and infrastructure.

Our **Priority Outcome 9** is to increase the percentage of residents who think that Sevenoaks is a clean area

- 79% of respondents to the 2007/08 Clean Kent Survey felt that Sevenoaks was a clean area to live. This represents a 4% change from the last survey conducted in 2003.

Our **Priority Outcome 10** is to ensure there is an appropriate policy in place in the Local Development Framework to deal with climate change issues. It also aims to implement action plans to improve air quality in the 11 designated air quality management areas and undertake further assessments

- The Preferred Options for the LDF Core Strategy will incorporate policies to deal with climate change issues.
- There are now 11 designated air quality management areas (AQMA's) in the District. The majority of actions in the current plan are progressing well and on time. Permission has been given by Defra to review and update the existing Air Quality Action Plan and produce a new Plan combining it with all the newly declared AQMA's within the District.

Successes during 2007/08

- The bid to the Community Energy Efficiency fund for a Rural Home Visitor worker has been successful and will commence in 2008/09. This will assist in reducing fuel poverty in the District and contribute to affordable warmth targets.
- Operation Cubit is a multi-agency scheme for dealing with abandoned and untaxed vehicles. 110 vehicles were removed by Operation Cubit during 2007/08.
- 84 vehicles voluntarily surrendered under a scheme run by Sevenoaks District Council.
- There were a record number of entries (105) to the Gardening for Wildlife Award Scheme in 2007 and 150 people attended the Celebration event in September.
- Furness School in Hextable and The New Beacon School in Sevenoaks achieved Silver Eco-School status in 2007/8.
- Shoreham Village School and Hever CE Primary School were awarded Clean Kent School awards in 2007/8.
- Sevenoaks District Council made a commitment to tackle climate change by officially signing the Nottingham declaration to on climate change.

What are the challenges ahead?

- Work over the next year includes completing complete a significant part of the required background studies and preparing the Preferred Options Core Strategy to go out to consultation.
- Supporting delivery of the targets within the Kent Partnership Agreement's Economic Success and Environmental Excellence themes.

Green and Healthy Environment

How did we do?

Our **Priority Outcome 11** is to monitor and increase the number of people participating in identified healthy lifestyle and Choosing Health programmes

- During 2007/08, a total of 26 healthy lifestyle initiatives have taken place for people within the District. At these initiatives, over 11,100 attendances were recorded at over 670 individual sessions. This is an increase of 37% on 2006/07 figures.

Our **Priority Outcome 12** is to monitor and increase the number of additional services offered to those most in need at primary care level.

- A total of sixteen additional service packages were offered to groups of those most in need by local community health services such as GP's in Sevenoaks District Council area. These have included visiting medical officers in Valence School and in ten nursing homes in the area. It also includes "shared care" services in five locations in the District for people requiring drug dependency reduction support.

Successes during 2007/08

- West Kent Primary Care Trust agreed a £294,000 contract with Oasis Dental Care Ltd to provide NHS dental services in Sevenoaks. This is part of a £1.8million package to tackle a lack of NHS dental provision in areas where it has either not been available or has been lost as a result of practices withdrawing from NHS provision. The contract with Oasis is one of five, which together are expected to boost the number of dental appointments available on the NHS in West Kent by 12%.
- The evaluation data from healthy lifestyles initiatives led by Sevenoaks District Council in partnership with the Primary Care Trust and Sencio Community Leisure, show that people reported positive health gains and outcomes as a result of initiatives. Some outcomes show increased levels of fitness, improved diet, weight loss, increase in social inclusion and improved mental wellbeing.

- Sevenoaks District Council Healthy Lifestyles team have worked with local communities and Parish Councils to train local people to become Health Walk Leaders. During 2007/08 over 45 people attended free health Walk Leader training and two new health walks were set up and are being sustained by volunteer Health Walk Leaders. Over 1,350 attendances were recorded on these two new walks in 2007/08.
- 312 people were given smoking cessation support in the District. An additional alcohol clinic has now been established in Swanley and is running at capacity.
- West Kent PCT Choosing Health funding in 2007/08 and 2008/09 has enabled Sevenoaks District Council to provide healthy lifestyles initiatives. Funding received during 2007/08 has funded a Choosing Health Co-ordinator post which is enabling existing projects to be rolled out and new projects to be within the District.
- A Community Sports Network has been set up to bring together major stakeholders with a joint interest in promoting physical activity and well being in the District.
- Sevenoaks District Council has obtained additional funding from the Kent Alliance on Smoking and Health (KASH) as to pursue an anti smoking project for secondary schools within the District.
- Leisure Centre cafes were refurbished and rebranded by Sencio and now offer healthier menu options.

What are the challenges ahead?

- Continuing to target healthy lifestyles initiatives within identified areas of need under the Choosing Health agenda.
- Continuing to provide better access and availability of services to those who are most in need, including NHS dentistry.
- Continuing to implement Smokefree Legislation within the District.
- Supporting delivery of the targets within the Kent Partnership Agreement's Improved Health, Care and Wellbeing and the Enjoying Life themes.

Dynamic Economy

The Community Plan is based on priorities identified by local people.

Our Dynamic Economy Priorities:

- Create an environment where businesses can flourish
- Enable local people to develop appropriate skills and qualifications to meet local needs”
- Help children to do well in local schools

Dynamic and Sustainable Economy

How did we do?

Our **Priority Outcome 13** is to deliver the West Kent Area Investment (AIF) Framework

- The AIF aims to promote business, maximise skills, sustain and strengthen the local economy and maximise opportunities for rural businesses across West Kent. In October 2007, 87% of the indicators in the Action Plan were on target.

Our **Priority Outcome 14** is to monitor and increase the number of 14-18 year olds achieving full or vocationally related qualifications at levels 1&2 (The National Qualifications Framework defines level 1 and 2 qualifications. Examples of Level 1 are a Level 1 NVQ or BTEC introductory diplomas or certificates; level 2 examples would be a NVQ Level 2 or BTEC first diplomas or certificates)

- In 2007, 268 pupils attending maintained schools in the District achieved qualifications at levels 1 & 2.

Our **Priority Outcome 15** is to increase the percentage of pupils achieving five GCSE's or more at grades A*-C

- In 2007/08 the number of pupils attending maintained schools in the District achieving five GCSE's or more at grades A-C in the District was 36.6%. This represents an increase of 3% from the 2005/06 period

Successes during 2007/08

- Three parent support advisors working across seven schools in Sevenoaks help parents support children's learning and breakdown any barriers to learning.
- The Harvey Centre is being developed at Swanley School which is part of the Swanley Safer Cluster initiative and is due to open next term. Kent County Council's Harvey Centre is a new initiative aimed at providing a range of facilities for young people in the 11-21 age range, particularly those at risk of social exclusion.
- Sevenoaks District council has continued to support local accommodation providers and work with local businesses and attractions to encourage sustainable tourism practices. This included the re-opening of Chiddingstone Castle and supporting a number new bed and breakfast providers.
- There were 446,228 visitors to the Districts top four attractions during 2007/08 (Knole, Chartwell, Hever Castle and Penshurst Place).
- It is estimated that around £153 million is spent by visitors to the District, directly benefitting local businesses including hotels, cafes, shops and attractions. The total value of tourism to the local economy is estimated to have supported 2,944 full-time equivalent jobs and 4,027 actual jobs (including seasonal and part-time employment).

What are the challenges ahead?

- The way children, young people and families' services are being commissioned across Kent is changing in 2008/09. Local Children's Services Partnerships have been created and there will be three partnerships covering the District. Each will draw together the public and voluntary sector who are providing services to children young people and their families. Each Partnership will be responsible for delivering a Local Children's and Young Peoples' plan focussed on local priorities.
- Supporting delivery of the targets within the Kent Partnership Agreement's Economic Success and Learning for Everyone themes.

Dynamic and Sustainable Economy

How did we do?

Our **Priority Outcome 16** is to produce and implement the Transport Plan for the District

- Following the 2006 Transport Conference the Sevenoaks District Transport Study was published in August 2007 to provide evidence in support of the transport strategy.
- The study sets out the key transport issues for the District and key options for the Transport Strategy. The study identifies issues such as congestion,
- A further conference was held in October 2007 to review the findings of the study and provide an input into the Transport Strategy.
- The Transport Strategy is currently in preparation, working with KCC, and should be completed in Summer 2008.

Our **Priority Outcome 17** is to ensure the right mix of housing and support is in place through the Local Development Framework, Housing Strategy and Balanced Communities initiative

- Preferred Options for the Core Strategy, incorporating policies covering housing provision and housing mix will be produced in September 2008. Key objectives for the new Housing Strategy currently being produced will reflect the Vision for Balanced Communities.
- 61 units of affordable housing were delivered in 2007/08

Our **Priority Outcome 18** is to increase the number of Parish plans and community initiatives progressed

- Village Design Statements have been recently prepared by communities in Weald, Halstead and Hartley
- There were 20 community initiatives progressed that involved working with local people by Sevenoaks District Council and West Kent Extra during 2007/08.

Successes during 2007/08

- A Transport Stakeholders group has been set up to steer the provision of transport services in the District.
- The Swanley Neighbourhood Project led by West Kent Extra and West Kent Housing has attracted members from within the settled traveller community who are now helping to shape local services.
- A Planning for Real exercise led by Sevenoaks District Council attracted over 600 people who gave their views about the future of the Swanley Town Centre.
- A rural housing scheme of ten affordable housing units was developed and completed in Leigh in 2007.

What are the challenges ahead?

- Taking forward the Transport Strategy and promoting measures to encourage more sustainable travel within the District.
- Continuing to work to increase the number of affordable housing units delivered within the District.
- Supporting delivery of the targets within the Kent Partnership Agreement's Keeping Kent Moving and High Quality Homes themes.

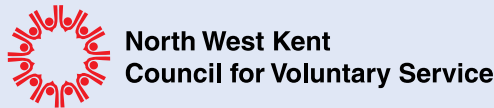

The Sevenoaks District

Local Strategic Partnership (LSP)

The Sevenoaks District Community Planning Partnership was formed in March 2004 to co-ordinate and monitor delivery of the Action Plan against the key aims and agreed actions. In 2008 it became the Sevenoaks District Local Strategic Partnership. It is made up of representatives from the following organisations who work closely together:

- o Sevenoaks District Council
- o Kent County Council
- o West Kent Police
- o West Kent Housing Association
- o Business Link Kent
- o Kent Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty
- o Churches Together in Sevenoaks
- o Connexions Kent & Medway
- o Moat Housing
- o North West Kent Council for Voluntary Service
- o Sencio Community Leisure
- o West Kent Primary Care Trust
- o Voluntary Action West Kent (VAWK)
- o West Kent Extra

All lead agencies have agreed to be responsible for delivering targets within the Plan and they provide monitoring information about their work to the Partnership quarterly. Other partners, including Town and Parish Councils are also closely involved in delivering projects at local level, together with many businesses, community and faith groups.

All targets are given a target status of green amber, red or missing. For the first year of the new Sustainable Community Action Plan 2007-2010, a target was set for 75% of the 122 actions to be on target to be completed. At the end of the first year of the Sustainable Community Action Plan, the following results were achieved:
