



## Sevenoaks District Community Safety Partnership

### Community Safety Unit Quarterly Report

1 April – 30 June 2010

#### Successes

Op Fairway was delivered to over 150 staff in June. Operation Fairway is a national campaign aimed at operational staff and businesses on how they could recognise vital information on terrorism and also where to pass information on to.

Op Restore was co-ordinated through the CSU. The week long operation highlighted activities to reduce environmental crime and ASB. Initiatives included removing fly tipping, graffiti removal and regenerating a park, addressing community safety issues with young people travelling by train, speeding checks, Environmental Visual Audit and estate inspections.

A PACT was set up in Crockenhill. The first PACT Panel meeting was on 17 June.

#### Proactive work undertaken by the CSU: All

The ASB Officer participated in visits with PC McGrath and PC Ingram. A joint visit was also made with the Animal Welfare officer to an individual in Swanley. Individuals have also been spoken to on visits with West Kent Housing and Moat Homes.

Engagement with Nathan Pascall-Smith relating to camera footage in Crockenhill

Highlighted from hand held device engagements, speeding has been an issue and off road bikes being ridden in an anti-social manner in public places. From this information local police and PCSO's have carried numerous activities, patrols and speed checks to deter this behaviour. Several motorists have received formal warnings and fixed penalty notices. Off road bikers have also had formal warnings and in some case's their bikes have been confiscated.

A lot of work is going on to encourage the use of Neighbourhood Watch schemes in residential areas conducted by the NHW officer and PCSO's

#### Reducing Anti-Social Behaviour - All

Joint ASB performance meeting to discuss taking proactive actions forward to reduce ASB. Changes to the daily tasking came through this meeting. Also addressing repeat and vulnerable victims and locations.

Both police and PCSO's continue to ride on local bus's and also on trains to provide re-assurance and to take note of any concerns travellers may have.

Bike marking and saddle marking has been carried out recently along with Safer plate events.

**Safety In Action Dorton House** : 19th April - 30th April 1500 year 6 primary school students educated in 10 differing safety scenarios. Police scenario focussed on **Anti - social behaviour**.

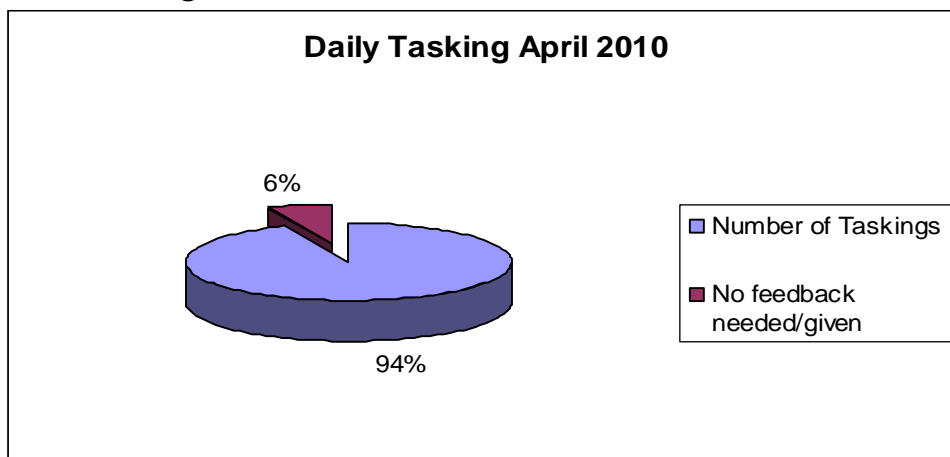

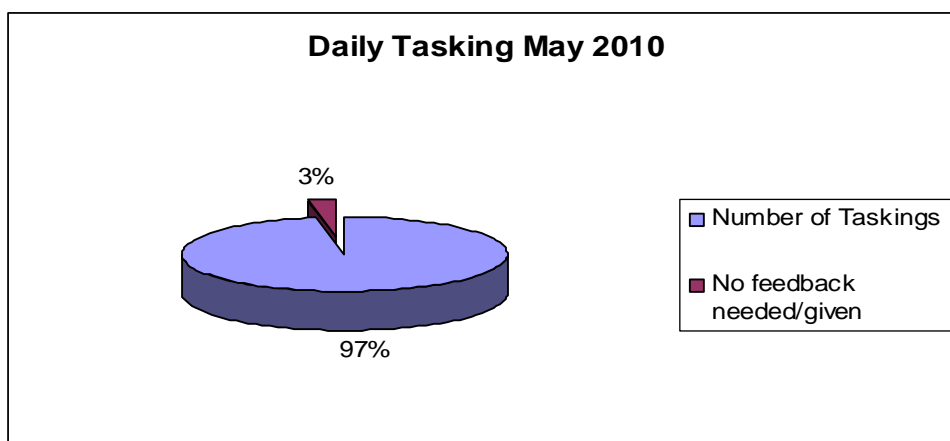

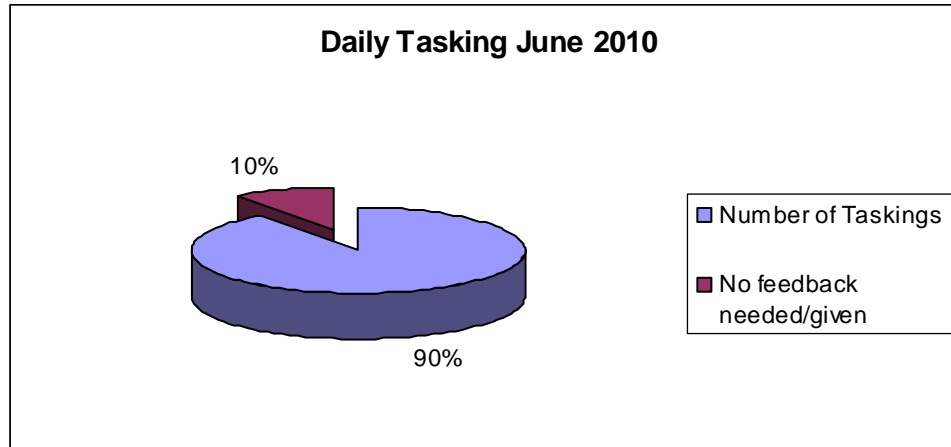
