

### Community Safety Unit Quarterly Report

1 July – 30 Sept 2010

#### Successes

The front counter was launched in July and officially opened by the Chief Constable on 2 September.



The Court granted our ASBO application for an individual in Swanley.

An Individual was banned from entering the grounds of the Vine through the County of Kent Act 1981.

Drug Awareness week took place. Activities included work in schools, high visibility patrolling where Ion Track was used and parent information packs.

1 EVA took place in Swanley, which had positive results.

#### **Proactive work undertaken by the CSU:**

Two Saferplate days carried out, Knockholt rail station and Asda's Swanley. Bike marking continues to be carried out.

There have been a number of visits with the ASB Officer, Police and Housing Associations across the District. Businesses affected by the ASBO were visited and guidance was provided on the Order and what action should be taken if this is breached.

**White Oak Leisure Centre** attracted 34 different young people throughout the week. According to the co-ordinator, the majority were new children who had not attended the site for school holiday activities before. The most popular session proved to be Pad Box with 6 attending. The leisure centre has since used this data to launch an evening session on the 27<sup>th</sup> October. The YP attending during the summer sessions were given a free first session for this date to hopefully sustain their interest. The all-inclusive sessions proved to be more difficult to promote only attracting 7 over the full week of activities.

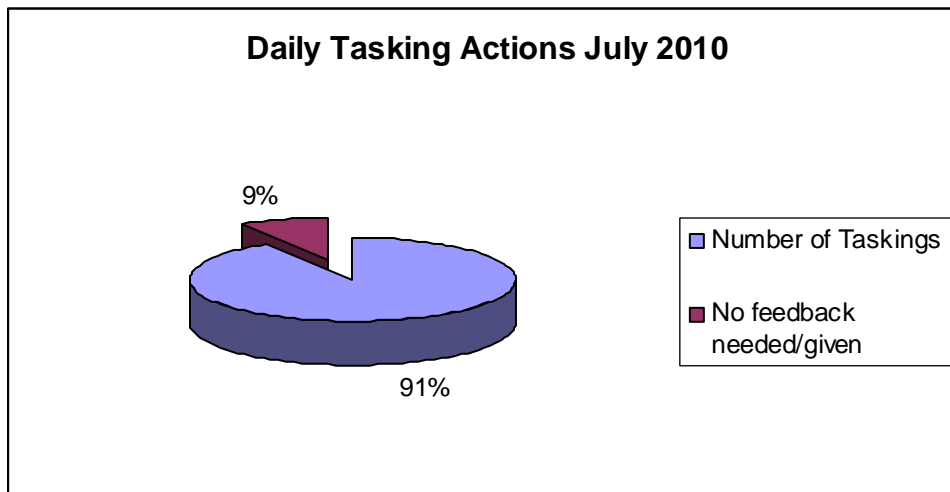
**Wilderness Sports Centre** attracted 26 YP. This was a mixture of boys and girls, some from the original pilot study and girls from Sevenoaks Junior Football Club. The Tennis coaching proved to be the most regularly attended sessions with 16 regularly attending. Each day attracted an average of 11-16 YP per day.

**Edenbridge Leisure Centre** already had an established holiday programme for 6-11 yrs and hosts regular day camp activities throughout the school holidays. The facilities were therefore limited for this programme. The sessions were therefore open to both age groups (6-11 & 11-16).

The most popular session proved to be the Interactive day on the 28<sup>th</sup> July (Dance and Reaction Mats). These sessions attracted 12 in the morning session and 6 in the afternoon. The tennis session didn't attract any YP - unlike the success of Wilderness who used the same coach linked from a local tennis academy.

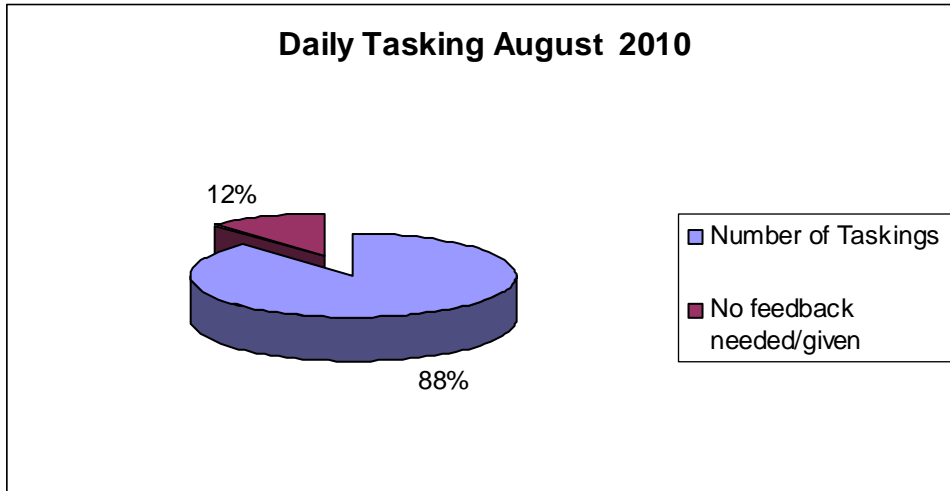

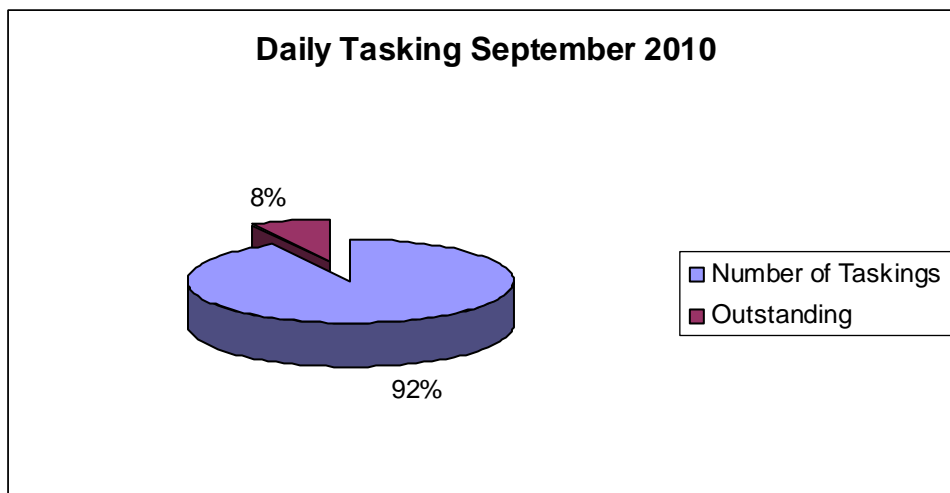
