<p>What are the 'full' and 'edited' registers?</p> <p>The full register lists the names and addresses of everyone who is registered to vote. The council holds a copy. Anyone can look at it, but it is a criminal offence to supply or use copies for purposes other than those set down in law. More information is available at www.aboutmyvote.co.uk</p> <p>The main use of the full register is to show who can vote in elections and referendums. Credit reference agencies can use it, but only to check your name and address if you are applying for credit and for other purposes specified in law. It can also be used for law enforcement.</p> <p>The edited register is available for general sale and can be used for any purpose. The edited register can be bought by any person, company or organisation and can be used for commercial activities such as marketing.</p> <p>(Your details will be included on the full register, for voting purposes, irrespective of whether you opt out of the edited register.)</p>

Registering to vote

You can only vote in elections if your name is on the register of electors. Registering to pay council tax does not mean that your name is automatically added to the register of electors. We update the register every autumn and add names throughout most of the year. You must sign your form yourself. We will write to tell you when your name has been added to the register. This is usually within 7 weeks (subject to no-one objecting). If you apply during an election period, you may not be able to vote at that election in respect of your new address. This is a legal process that councils have to follow.

As a guide, if this form is returned by the date shown in the first column any new electors will be added to the register on the date shown in the second column.

Nationality: Citizens of the European Union other than British or Irish and citizens of Cyprus and Malta may only vote in local elections.

16/17 Year Olds: You may vote from the date of your 18th birthday.

Students: If you consider you have a home during term time and a home during the holidays, you may be entitled to register in respect of both addresses and therefore section 3 may not be relevant.

Jury Service: Anyone over 70 may not serve on a jury. If there is any other reason why you may not serve on a jury, you can notify the Court Service when appropriate.

Postal Voting: If you have ticked this box, an application form to vote by post for an indefinite period will be sent to you.
