1 January – 31 March 2010

Successes

Plans for the joint District Council and Police Front Counter, at Argyle Road, Sevenoaks. Residents who usually use the Sevenoaks Police Station will be able to access Police counter services at the District Council offices at the end of June.

Sevenoaks District had the lowest recorded crime in Kent in 2009/10 with a 9.8% (-563 crimes) reduction.

Proactive work undertaken by the CSU:

Safer Plates:-

Police have conducted seven events in the district and fitted sets of anti-tamper number plate screws to over 273 vehicles.

Reducing Anti-Social Behaviour

Actions to tackle anti-social behaviour included:

- joint police and council visits to Swanley and Eynsford.
- Neighbourhood Watch meeting to discuss anti-social behaviour reports, how we respond to them and what we need from residents.
- there were 13 referrals to the Anti-Social Behaviour Task Group and 11 individuals showed an improvement in their behaviour.
- 3 warning letters and 3 Acceptable Behaviour Agreements issued.

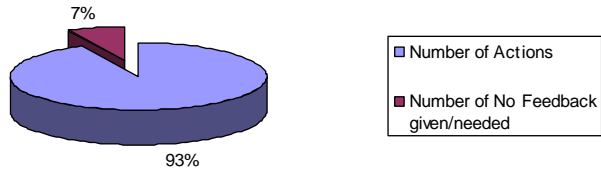

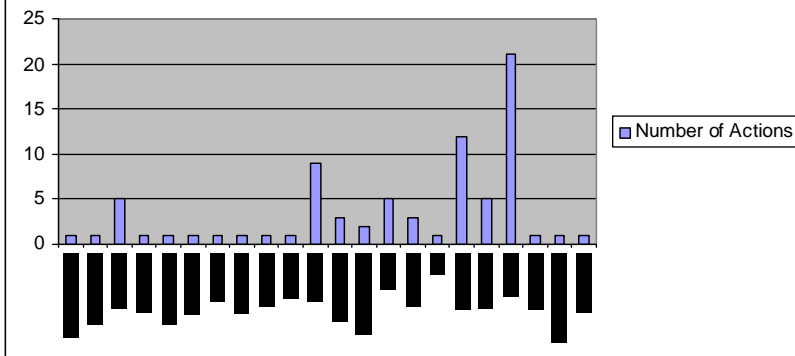

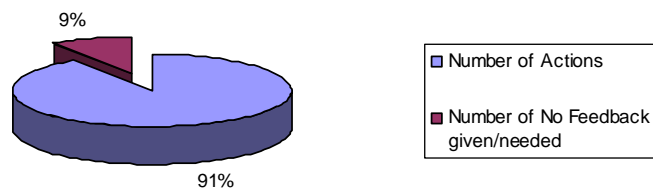
Ward Breakdown



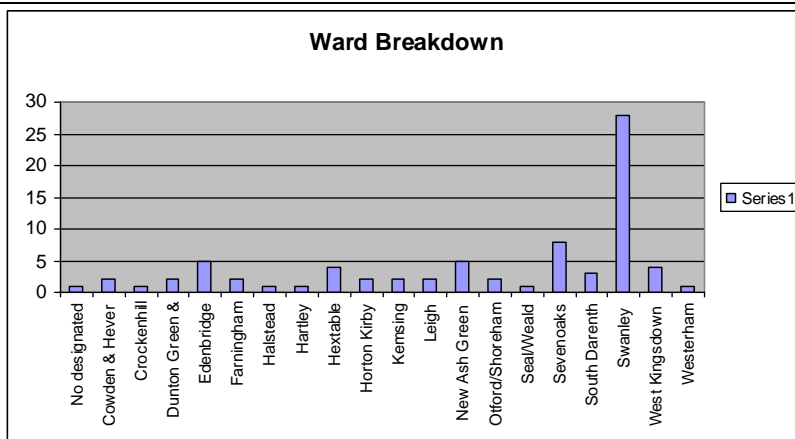

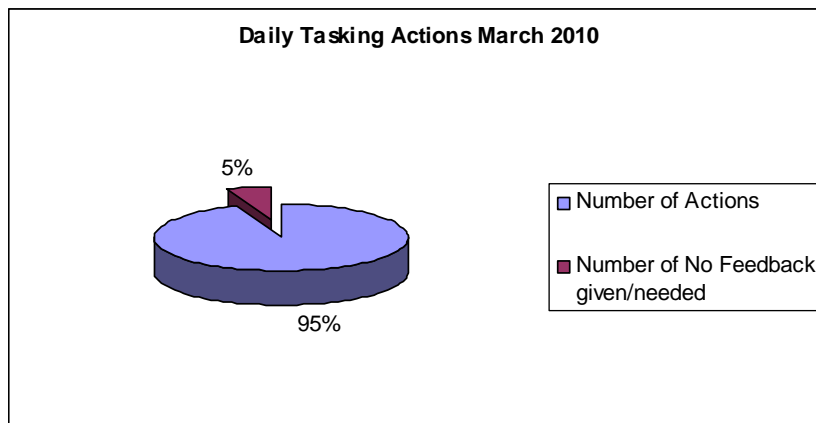

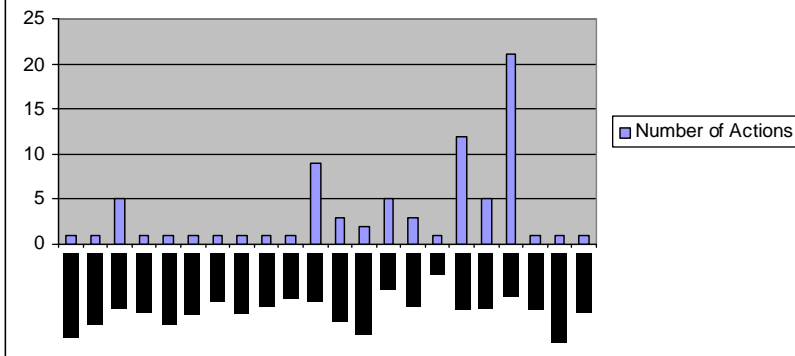

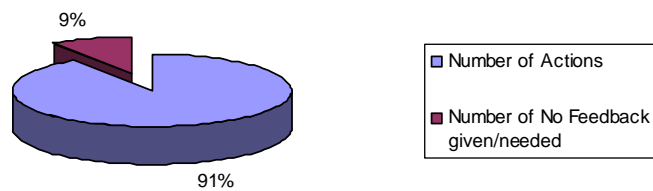
Ward Breakdown



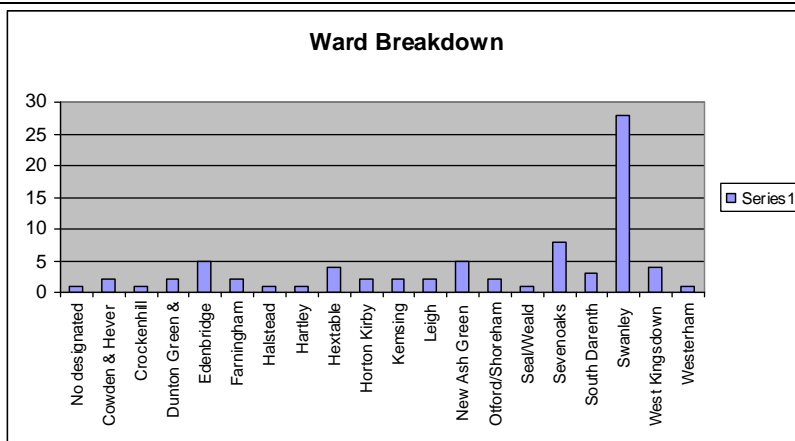

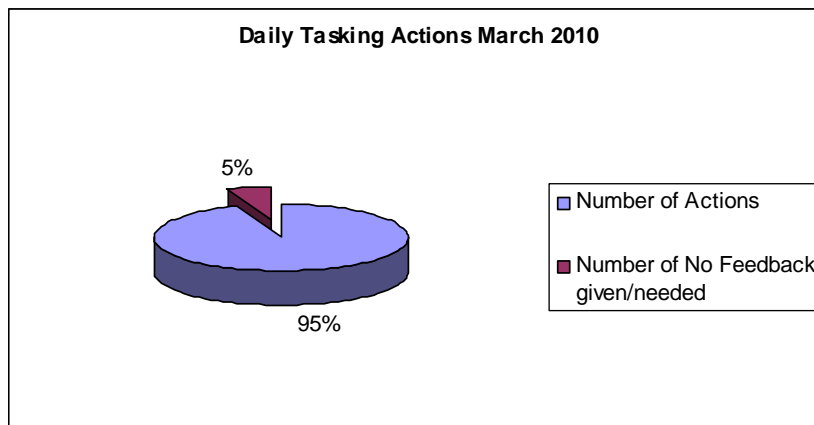
