

## 'Three and Four' equals a new sculpture for Blighs



The 2.3 metre tall public art piece was created by Oliver Barratt, an international artist who lives near Sevenoaks. The project has been paid for entirely by property developers from a fund specifically for public art.

The sculpture, abstract in nature, was inspired by the history of the area, most notably coppice trees and hop bines that once grew nearby. The vibrant green base is also a reference to the livery of the green buses that used Blighs when it was a bus station.

Cllr Roddy Hogarth, our Commissioner for the Public Realm, says: "We are extremely excited to have unveiled this fantastic new sculpture.

"Oliver Barratt has drawn on his extensive knowledge of the local area to produce a beautiful and thoughtful work that celebrates the history of Blighs, Sevenoaks and the wider District.

"As with all art, there can be strong opinions one way or the other. But I would encourage residents to come and see this bold and striking sculpture for themselves."

Oliver Barratt adds: "Many of the projects I work on are abroad and I only see them as they are being installed. With this work however, I will pass it every time I drive through my hometown.

"The sculpture looks forward in its contemporary visual language, it opens up the horizons to consider the rhythm and change of time.

"Art is a way of crystallising memory, of articulating a moment of thought and letting it find its way into the future. Public spaces are always competing for various functional needs, and art is a reminder that there is room in the marketplace for the poetic."

## Welcome to your new look In Shape!

You may have noticed, we've given In Shape a bit of a makeover with a new, modern and clearer design. But that's not the only change we've made.

As we work to become Net Zero by 2030, we've changed the In Shape paper to 'Carbon Neutral'.

All of the CO2 released during the production of the paper is measured and, if necessary, compensated for by carbon offsetting such as new tree planting.

We hope you enjoy your new look and more environmentally-friendly In Shape magazine.

## Working towards Net Zero!

Our commitment to make our operations Net Zero is one of our top priorities.

Here's a quick rundown of what we've done so far this year to reach our goal of going carbon neutral by 2030.

Recently we added two more electric vehicles to our fleet with two more on order. The new electric vans are used by our Environmental Enforcement Officers who regularly travel around the District.

Earlier in the year, we launched our Movement Strategy. The first in Kent, it promotes healthier, safer and sustainable travel over the next five to ten years. To help deliver these important changes and, despite not being the highway authority, we secured £1.2 million for a new east to west cycle and walking route in Sevenoaks town. We are now looking at how we can deliver similar schemes across the District.

We're also exploring the possibility of introducing an electric cycle rental scheme in Sevenoaks and the wider area. It has never been done in a rural area so would be a first. To move the project forward, we're working with a specialist consultant to assess how successfully the scheme could work.

Following an independent report showing improvements in air quality across the District, we asked for residents' views on how we can further reduce air pollution. We're also working with local schools to reduce car idling and promoting walking to school incentives.



To encourage our communities to take up electric powered vehicles, we have commissioned a company to identify the best locations for new, public charging points.



We are also working with the Kentbased carbon-saving experts 'Laser' to improve the energy efficiency of the buildings we own and occupy. Laser has carried out detailed surveys and in the coming weeks will tell us what more we can do to make the buildings energy efficient and sustainable. Laser is also working with us to see what more can be done to reduce the emissions of our refuse fleet and other vehicles. We are also saving carbon this year by planting new trees, installing electric charging points across our car parks, assisting residents with solar power and more!

With other organisations across Kent, we're to encourage everyone to make changes to reduce their energy use. You can find out about the campaign on our website and social media accounts where there's lots of tips for small, low and no cost changes that you can make today!

Finally, we are already seeing our carbon emissions fall thanks to the energy saving work we've already carried out.

In 2019/20, the carbon emissions for our offices and vehicles stood at 1,394 tonnes. By 2021/22, this had dropped to 853 tonnes, a whopping 39% reduction.



## Your new waste collection days

You should have now received your postcard with your new waste collection day. Please keep it handy, ready for the new collection days that start from 17 October.

The change, the first in more than a decade, will improve the efficiency of the service, saving on fuel and helping the environment.

While most households will have a new collection day, some will have the same day as now.

Even if your collection day remains the same, you should put your sacks out at 7am as our crews could arrive earlier than you are used to.

Our fortnightly garden waste collection days are changing too. From 17 October, garden waste collections will always take place on the same day as your new waste collection day. Please put your bins and sacks out at 7am.

## New safer socialising scheme is 'Best Bar None'

A new scheme to promote safer pubs and bars has been launched in the District.

'Best Bar None' is a national accreditation scheme supported by the Home Office and drinks industry. It was launched in the Sevenoaks District in July.

Businesses who want to join the scheme are assessed by our licensing team and the Community Safety Unit, which includes Council staff and the police.

To be accredited, businesses must demonstrate they are committed to creating a friendly and safe environment.

This means they should manage their venue effectively, provide staff training and be committed to customer safety, welfare and service. They must also commit to working with us and the police to keep customers and communities safe.

The accreditation lasts for a year.

**Employment and economy:** The pandemic has accelerated online shopping and home working. We are keen to support our high streets and deliver the right type of workspaces to meet current and future needs so our economy remains strong.

**Protecting the environment:** The Green Belt covers over 90% of the District so the overwhelming majority will continue to be protected, as will natural resources and our built heritage, safeguarding the character of the District.

**Transport and infrastructure:** The Local Plan will enable the delivery of new infrastructure to meet future needs.

**Healthy places and spaces:** Ensuring new developments promote good mental and physical health.

**Delivering Net Zero:** New developments will have the minimum impact on the environment, including low carbon emissions to help tackle climate change.

**Encouraging good design:** New developments will be high quality places and spaces that respect local character.

## Keeping an eye on the District

Our CCTV system is not only doing its bit to fight crime, it helps to keep the public safe in lots of other ways.

The 144 CCTV cameras cover Sevenoaks, Swanley, Westerham, Edenbridge and New Ash Green 365 days of the year.

Most cameras pan, tilt and zoom with all of the footage digitally recorded. Live images can also be relayed to the Police, and other partners, in real time.

In the year up to 31 March 2022, the CCTV control room instigated, assisted or monitored 103 arrests across the District.

A recent success, over the summer, led to the arrest of a group of shoplifters from east London.

Our CCTV operators became suspicious of the group who entered Boots in Sevenoaks wearing large coats and jumpers on one of the hottest days of the year.

When they left the store, CCTV operators spotted items hidden under their clothing.

The team relayed live images of the suspects to Kent Police along with their descriptions and direction of travel.

CCTV monitored the group until the Police arrived shortly afterwards.

The Police stopped the three teenagers and found a large quantity of suspected stolen items with an estimated value of around £10,260.

The three were charged with theft and ordered to attend Medway Magistrates' Court.

The CCTV control room is at the centre of the Shopsafe and Pubwatch schemes. Retailers and publicans in Swanley, Sevenoaks and Edenbridge are linked to the control room via two-way radios.

CCTV control room staff are alerted of incidents so they can be monitored and, if necessary, reported to the Police. Partners in the scheme are told in an instant if trouble is heading their way. Last year, the CCTV team took over 400 Shopsafe and Pubwatch calls.

The CCTV team also deal with out-ofhours emergencies. These can cover floods, noise complaints, stray dogs, homelessness, dangerous buildings and missing people. Last year they handled 1,196 emergency calls.

Last December, the team took an early morning call from the Police about an older lady with dementia who had walked out of her care home. CCTV scoured the area and within the hour, they found the lady sheltering from the cold behind an advertising hoarding wearing only her night clothes and slippers. The team monitored the situation until the Police attended.

Not only is the system keeping us safe, it also informs drivers of local road congestion. The CCTV control room has direct links to motoring organisations who share traffic problems helping to make motorists aware of the local traffic situation.


The price of energy, food and other bills has risen steeply in recent months and many people are struggling to keep up with the cost of living. However, help may be available.

## Sustainable living

Our local businesses and landowners are rising to the Net Zero challenge by finding new ways to embrace a lower carbon footprint. From natural products to preloved goods and environmentally-friendly produce, so much is happening!



Eagle Heights Wildlife Foundation near Eynsford is best known for its work rehabilitating raptors and other wildlife and for putting on amazing flying displays.

Owners Samantha and Jonathan not only support many conservation projects but are also passionate about creating environmentally-friendly nature areas. These areas, left wild, support local flora and fauna. While they may not look 'tidy', they do a huge amount of good.

Lately the Foundation has been encouraging other businesses to collaborate on climate-friendly activities. They have invited groups with sustainable preloved attire to set up racks of clothes for visitors to browse while on a day out at this beautiful location perched high on the Kent Downs. Donations of clothes are very welcome. Bamboo socks and eco housewares are also on sale, together with organic skin care products from Goats of the Gorge, made with minimal impact. Some contain alpaca

keratin, great for soft skin as it turns out. The Foundation is proud to have been awarded a Silver Medal for Green Tourism.

Possibly one of the best ways to go shopping - with a lighter carbon footprint - is to visit one of the fabulous charity or antique shops in our area.

The Visit Sevenoaks District website recently added a Charity Shop Trail, focusing on a circuit in Sevenoaks town, taking in the huge new Hospice in the Weald on the High Street, which has a designer clothes sales in October.

Check the trail to read about each of the shops and their special offers, and perhaps take in a delicious vegan lunch at the low climate impact café Life on High while you're there.

For those living in or visiting Westerham, there are also great shops to browse, like the Chartwell Cancer Charity shop (preloved\_westerham on Instagam). Westerham also has some wonderful antique shops (buying preloved furniture is very sustainable), as does nearby Brasted, a village renowned for the high standard of its antiques offer.

There are also some proper Aladdin's caves at Otford Antiques & Collectors Centre (with 34 dealers) together with Otford Interiors, stockists of a vast array of antique furniture and collectables, which also has an in-house upholstery and restoration service. There are plenty of charity and antique shops in Edenbridge (one owned by Antiques Roadshow regular Lennox Cato no less!) and several charity shops in Swanley too. For all the details, check the Visit Sevenoaks District website.

If visiting a garden centre is your way of relaxing (and making your garden a wildlife haven) then Coolings near Knockholt is a great option. For years, the Coolings family has been working to lower its carbon footprint, harvesting rainwater from their onsite reservoirs and using alternatives to single use plastics where possible.



They have also installed electric-vehicle charging points and motion-sensitive lighting, created their own compost, grow over 80% of the stock on site and lots more.

Their work was recognised when they clinched the 'Environment' category in the 2019 Kent Excellence in Business Awards.

Or perhaps go on a day trip to Bore Place, a historic venue near Chiddingstone, which offers all sorts of activities for families and groups, all focused on sustainable solutions. The whole site is low carbon, utilising renewable energy for its heating and hot water. All businesses working on the site are mutually beneficial in some way. With several eco-friendly houses, cottages and glamping venues for rent, Bore Place was thrilled to be awarded a Gold by Green Tourism! And if you're planning a wedding or event, they don't get more eco than this venue. All food is locally sourced and waste is composted or recycled. Any profits are ploughed back into eco-projects.



One final bonus for our area is the recent creation of the Darent Valley Farming Cluster, a group of 18 farms and landowners supported by Kent Wildlife Trust, working together to improve habitats.

This involves identifying funding, initiatives (like creating wildlife corridors within and between farms), improving water quality and drainage, working on climate change mitigation, and producing food in a more sustainable way. With over 2,500 hectares involved, this could have a huge beneficial impact. They are looking for volunteers, so do get in touch if interested.

For more inspiration and ideas about how to reduce you own carbon footprint, do think about checking local sustainability sites, which have tons of great ideas. Sustainable Edenbridge is a community group, formed by local people, that constantly adds new ideas and links.

The recently established Sevenoaks Climate Action Network (SCAN) is also bringing people together in a broad network, enabling collaboration and the exchange of ideas, with a big Climate Fair planned for next year.

Brenda started our weight management course over Zoom with advisors Natalie and Natalia. Her main issue was finding time to exercise and cutting down on wine. The sessions taught Brenda that she had been eating and drinking out of habit and there were healthier alternatives.

Brenda says: "I found the Zoom sessions and listening to other group members who were also struggling with their eating and finding time for exercise so helpful. I also liked the workbooks, which include keeping a diary of foods I have eaten and what is meant by activity and the many forms it can take. At no point during the course did I feel judged by the two lead workers and only received positive feedback and encouragement all of the way."

Six months on, Brenda has lost almost two stone, several inches off her waist and her cholesterol is much lower!

**Brenda Armstrong from** West Kingsdown had tried every diet plan going so this time when she decided to lose weight, she wanted to do something different. After a call with her GP. Brenda was referred to our One You service.

She's learnt about portion control, is exercising more and doesn't even miss her glasses of wine any more.

Brenda adds: "I've dropped a dress size and am back into clothes I could not wear previously. I am enjoying being the size I am and that I have found a way of eating that suits me and that I do not feel deprived of anything at all."

As part of her role, she's developed a weight management programme for adults with learning disabilities. ## Don't lose your vote!

Each year, we carry out the annual canvass to update the electoral register, which lists the names and addresses of everyone who can vote.

We have written to every household in the District to check the details we currently hold are correct.

If your details are wrong, you may not be able to vote in future elections, including next May's local elections.

This year, it is easier than ever to take part in the canvass and in many cases, no action is required. Your canvass form will indicate if you need to confirm your details.

However, we're still waiting to hear from some people who need to respond. If we do not hear from these people, a canvasser may call or visit their homes to collect the information.

The canvasser will offer advice to help complete the forms for anyone who is unsure what to do.

Look out for your annual canvass forms during the autumn and follow the instructions to make sure your details on the electoral register are up-to-date.

## The explosive problem of discarded aerosol cans



One of our waste collectors narrowly avoided a serious injury when a full aerosol can exploded in the back of a dustcart in Swanley.

This incident happened on Friday 8 July when a black sack with the aerosol can was placed in the back of the waste vehicle. When the compactor crushed the sack, the aerosol exploded without warning resulting in an injury to the crew member.

He was hit on the face by the debris and was taken to hospital. Luckily, he was not seriously injured. However, it could have been a lot worse as the remnants of the can struck close to one of his eyes.



We are reminding residents never to put an aerosol can in a black sack. Instead, always ensure the can is completely empty and placed in a clear recycling sack. If the aerosol cannot be emptied, it can be safely disposed of at one of Kent County Council's Household Waste Recycling Centres.

Cabinet Member for Cleaner and Greener, Cllr Margot McArthur, says: "Placing any aerosol can that is not completely empty in a waste sack may not seem dangerous, but it can pose a genuine threat to our staff. These cans are pressurised and can rupture and explode when crushed.

"Our amazing refuse collectors work tirelessly for residents so we want to make sure we keep them safe and are urging residents to not let this happen again."

### Sports development is the priority in Swanley

He says: "I started at Everyone Active in January and was brought in to help with the opening and running of the new White Oak Leisure Centre.

"I have worked in leisure since I was 16. I've progressed from being a lifeguard to a Duty Manager and now I'm a Sports Development Manager. I work with the local community, local clubs and organisations to provide greater sporting opportunities."

Robert adds: "I am working closely with Kent County Council's Reconnect programme. We have already run initiatives like free swim weekends, discounted Tag Active and soft play and free swimming for children on free school meals.

"The scheme aims to get young people into leisure activities after the pandemic, with a focus on those who receive free school meals. I'm also working on other projects like 'This Girl Can' providing women only swimming lessons. There's lots going on, which is really exciting."

At White Oak Leisure Centre, you can enjoy a 25m six lane main pool, learner pool, state of the art 100-station fitness suite, two exercise studios, virtual group cycling studio, and a sports hall. For those who want to try something new, the centre also boasts a brand-new interactive gaming activity, TAGactive.

## Reconnecting success

Over the summer, Sencio Community Leisure also received support from the Reconnect programme for children and young people. The Kent County Council initiative was designed to connect them with the things they'd missed during the pandemic. We asked Sencio's Paul Jobling to tell us more.

#### Why did Sencio want to get involved in Reconnect?

We're passionate about getting young people involved in health and fitness, both following the past two years and in addressing this country's obesity problem. Reconnect was the perfect programme to support this.

#### With what sort of activities did the young people become involved in? And what were their ages?

It was a real mixture, from swimming and badminton to basketball, gym work and fitness classes. We had children as young as three come along for their first swim up to young adults aged 21 using the gym. It was also great to see lots of 16 to 18 year olds come to us during the summer holidays after finishing their exams.

#### What feedback have you had?

People praised the excellent value for money and the range of activities available but, what was also nice for us, was all the great comments about our staff.

#### Have there been any individuals/stories that have impressed you?

We've had young adults with disabilities and medical conditions come and use our facilities for the first time. This was really fantastic to see and, without Reconnect, they may well never have come to us.

We're hearing a lot (post-pandemic) about young people and mental health. Does Sencio hope to build on the success of Reconnect?

Absolutely. Reconnect has opened up opportunities for young people to come and experience what we offer and feel all the benefits, physically, mentally and socially. We're really proud to do our bit and help young people along the way.





## They're feeling good in Edenbridge

A new suite of machines designed to provide an alternative, low impact way to exercise for those with health conditions or mobility concerns has proved an instant success with customers at Edenbridge Leisure Centre.



David Peckham (69) joined the Feel Good suite following a hip replacement in the summer and says: "The experience so far has been better than expected and I have been able to increase my general mobility. The staff have also been extremely helpful and demonstrated their knowledge in helping me in my recovery."

For 79-year-old Richard Evemy, his visits to the suite are all part of what he describes as his "plan to stay healthy as long as I can". And, as someone who lives alone, he's quick to add that his visits have become the "social highlight of my day."

Owen Gemmell (72) says it was high praise from friends that led him to join. He says: "I've had leg and knee

pain for some time and am waiting to see an orthopaedic surgeon. My mobility was greatly reduced, however, after just a few sessions I am now able to cycle from home to the centre. That's 15 miles!"

### De-light your neighbours with these bonfire alternatives

With the arrival of autumn, you may be thinking about having a bonfire to get rid of your garden waste.

While there are no restrictions on when you can have a bonfire, the smoke could upset your neighbours, leaving them fuming. What's more, if your bonfire causes a nuisance, we can take action.

Instead of having a bonfire, consider these alternatives, which are a surefire way of keeping everyone happy:

Make use of our garden waste collection service www. sevenoaks.gov.uk/gardenwaste Try home composting - it's good for the environment. Discounted compost bins are available from www.sevenoaks.gov.uk/compost

Take your garden waste to one of KCC's Household Waste and **Recycling Centres** 

Right now, following months of dry weather, we would advise against having a bonfire as there's a risk nearby vegetation could catch light. However, if you decide to have one, you can reduce the impact of smoke by:

- Only burning dry vegetation or clean, untreated wood
- Never burning plastics, rubber, treated or painted wood or general waste
- Having as few bonfires as possible
- Telling your neighbours and never starting a fire if they have washing on the line or if they're using their garden
- Building it as far away from neighbouring properties as possible
- Monitoring the fire and, if it could cause annoyance, put it out
- Never leave a bonfire unattended or left to smoulder.

### Improving the air we breathe

### The District's air quality is improving, which is good news for everyone.

However, there's more we can all do to help cut air pollution.

For many years, we have monitored local air quality while at the same time working with partners, residents and businesses to deliver plans to clean up the air we breathe.

This work, along with more efficient and cleaner vehicles, has led to a drop in air pollution.

However, more needs to be done. We still have four areas where air pollution exceeds, or is likely to exceed, Government recommended limits. So this year, we launched a new plan with more than 30 actions to improve air quality.

The plan includes encouraging parents to turn off their engines when dropping off pupils, especially around schools near busy roads.

Other actions include working with KCC to deliver junction and other road improvements to cut congestion, promoting cleaner forms of travel and moving more of our fleet to electric vehicles.

In June, we installed an air quality monitoring device at Riverhead Infants' School. If there is a spike in air pollution at dropping off and pick up times, we'll work with parents to help tackle the issue.

#### How you can help

Nearly all air pollution comes from human activities, such as driving, construction and bonfires.

You can help by:

- Reducing unnecessary car trips
- Where possible, using public transport, walking or cycling
- Turning off your car engine when sitting in the vehicle when it's stationary
