

Your new Council

Thousands of people voted in the local elections on 4 May 2023 to have their say about who should run Sevenoaks District Council.

After all the votes were counted, the Conservatives had a majority of 33 seats on the Council.

The remaining seats were claimed by 14 Liberal Democrats, four Green Party Councillors and three Independent Councillors.

Of the 54 Councillors elected, 23 were new faces and 22 were women.

Women now make up 40% of our Councillors. This is above the national average which is closer to 33%

according to figures published just before the election.

Your District Councillors decide the policies and priorities of the Council. They represent the needs of local residents and are available to help with local issues.

Our new Council Leader

Cllr Julia Thornton was elected as our new Council Leader at the Annual Council meeting on 23 May 2023.

Cllr Thornton was born in Sevenoaks and has lived most of her life close to the town, only moving away during her university years. She was first elected to the Council in 2011 and was our Cabinet member for Planning and Conservation from 2019 to 2023. Prior to becoming a Councillor, Cllr Thornton worked in marketing and communications for 20 years.

Cllr Thornton says: "It's such an honour and a privilege to have been elected as the Council Leader. My dad was a Kent County Councillor for 12 years, so public service is in my blood! I cannot wait to get on and deliver our residents' priorities.

"I would like to pay tribute to my predecessor, Peter Fleming, who was our Leader for 18 years. He made us one of the most revered and financially sound local authorities in the country, winning Council of the year and Council Leader of the year.

"Despite being in a uniquely strong financial position, as with all councils, we have challenges ahead. But these are also exciting times and we have a new Cabinet who will be at the forefront of delivering our vision and ambitions.

"Our immediate focus is protecting the Green Belt from inappropriate development and retaining our weekly waste and recycling collections. We will continue to work to reduce the Council's carbon footprint while supporting our communities to cut their carbon emissions.

"We'll continue to invest in the District, helping to regenerate our town centres, while ensuring we remain financially self-sufficient so we can support the services that matter most to our residents."

Mill Pond improvements

We are investing more than £60,000 to rejuvenate a historic pond for the benefit of wildlife and people.

The Mill Pond in Seal Road, Sevenoaks is relatively small, but has the potential to have a big positive impact on the environment. It is home to birds, insects and fish, including spawning salmon, and is much loved by local people.

But over the years it has become silted allowing certain vegetation to take hold impacting on its appearance. It has also suffered from pollution.

Mill Pond is fed by nearby springs and storm water from highway drains.

Silt from roads and nearby building projects has, over time, built up in the pond. Oil and other pollutants

from the highway have washed into the pond and in 2021, the Mill Pond suffered contamination from a Thames Water culvert.

In recent years, the Greatness Residents' Association secured funding to transform the pond into a nature reserve. This included new silt traps, putting in nature friendly plants and installing benches. To help with the Association's ambitions, we started a big clean-up operation in March.

To start, we brought in a specialist contractor to desilt the pond. This work has removed most of the contamination that has built up over years. We've also put in new wildlife friendly plants.

The wooden boardwalk has rotted and now needs replacing. We are exploring options, which could include a new path and railings, allowing better access and helping us to maintain and clean the pond going forward.

We're also in discussions with Thames Water about new measures to stop further pollution.

In the coming months and years, we expect the Mill Pond to flourish again for both nature and residents.







Have your say on our walking, wheeling and cycling plans

As we move forward with a new walking, wheeling and cycling route linking east to west Sevenoaks town, we're asking for your views on our proposals.

The route, drawn up with help fron transport experts Sustrans, will provide walkers, wheelers (people on scooters, parents with prams and wheelchair users) and riders with safe routes to six schools and Sevenoaks Rail station.

This will provide safer opportunities for residents to exercise, benefitting their health, while improving air quality and helping to move the District towards Net Zero. The route could also take some cars off the road, especially at busy times, helping to reduce traffic congestion, so there is something for everyone.

The two mile route will link Amherst and Riverhead Schools in the west with Trinity School and

The route, drawn up with help from transport experts Sustrans, will and Tunbridge Wells Grammar School for Boys annexes in the east.

The proposals include widening existing footpaths, the creation of new links between existing footpaths and upgrading road crossings.

The route would be delivered in partnership with Kent County Council with £1.2 million already secured from the Government.

Work on the route is expected to begin in 2024.

We have also secured additional funding to progress two further walking, wheeling and cycling routes linking Sevenoaks and Otford and a new walking, wheeling and cycling plan in Swanley.

Cllr Julia Thornton, Leader of the Council says:


"Encouraging our residents to use safe, sustainable forms of travel is a top priority and forms part of our Net Zero ambitions. By improving transport connections, this safe and sustainable travel route, we hope the route will be popular with children, commuters and the wider community.

"We have the funds and a plan in place to deliver this important project, but we really want to hear the views of our communities before we take the next steps."

Leisure sites reopen with community fun days

Thousands of residents joined local Olympic gold medalists Kate French and Joe Choong to celebrate the reopening of Edenbridge and Sevenoaks Leisure Centres.

The two centres, now run by leisure operator Everyone Active, opened their doors to the public on bank holiday Monday 1 May with an exciting day of free events and activities.

Both leisure centres offered a wide array of free activities including gym and swim, group exercise and sports hall activity taster sessions, alongside face painting and balloon modelling.

Customers could meet and greet the attending Olympians, who visited both centres. Hundreds of residents took out leisure centre memberships on the day.

The open day followed hot on the heels of Lullingstone Golf Course reopening on Saturday 22 April. The golf course is also now operated by Everyone Active.

All three leisure sites had been run by Sencio Community Leisure for the past 20 years until the independent trust ceased trading on 17 March.

Within a month, Councillors agreed to provide £1.83 million in funding to cover reopening and running costs and we appointed Everyone Active to operate all three leisure facilities on an interim basis for up to two years.

Prior to reopening, the three sites underwent a deep clean, redecoration and other improvements.

Everyone Active has reduced the cost of memberships and many activities to encourage more people to get active.

Everyone Active has operated our new leisure centre in Swanley since February 2022. In the first year alone, some 400,000 customers came through the doors and memberships increased from just a few hundred to more than 3,000.

Cllr Lesley Dyball, our Cabinet Member for People and Places, says: "We're excited to be partnering with Everyone Active to manage Edenbridge and Sevenoaks Leisure Centres and Lullingstone Park Golf Course.

"They organised fabulous community events to mark their reopening with a wide range of activities, all for free.

"Everyone Active has an excellent track record of innovation and amazing customer service and has transformed leisure provision in Swanley by bringing hundreds of thousands of customers into the centre. With their new ideas and experience of running more than 200 leisure facilities, they will help to make health and leisure accessible to even more of our residents."



It's so important that you put the right things in your clear sacks. Just one item that doesn't belong in there could condemn the whole bag.

You can also do your bit for the environment by making sure you don't put recyclable waste in your black sacks. On average, 20% of refuse in black sacks could have been recycled!

We're asking you to make A PACT with us to recycle more and remember what to put in your recycling bags:

Put all of these items in your clear sacks...











You can also help by making sure you put your waste out at 7am on your collection day to avoid attracting animals and the build-up of litter.

Hedge your bets!

Summer is here, which means lots more time enjoying the garden.

If you're plant potty about maintaining your outdoor space, sign up to our unbeleafably easy and environmentally friendly garden waste service!

Our thyme saving service means less trips to the tip and protects the inside of your car from mud and dirt. It's also good for the environment as all the garden waste we take away is composted then sold as a soil improver and fertilizer.

It's picked up fortnightly on the same day as your rubbish and recycling is collected, and there are two options to choose from:


• An annual permit for a 240-litre bin for £50 or a 140-litre bin for £35

• 25 garden waste sacks for £20

Celebrating five years of commons improvements

Over the past five years, dozens of local volunteers have banded together to help improve our local commons for the benefit of people and nature.

The Commons of Sevenoaks, Westerham and Seal had, over many decades, become neglected and overgrown. The sites were less well used by the public and rare habitats such as heathland, had declined.

But in 2018 the Council along, with the Kent Wildlife Trust, landowners and others, launched the Sevenoaks Greensand Commons Project to bring some much needed TLC to 120 hectares of the 300 hectare sites.

The project put out a call to the local community to support the ambitious project and many volunteers came forward. Andrew Willmore, the Greensand Commons Project Manager explains, they could not have succeeded without the help of these committed volunteers.

"We've been blown away by the response from the local community," says Andrew. "So many volunteers have come forward and their support has been remarkable.

"Volunteers have learned how to lead a multitude of environmental tasks, use chainsaws and brush cutters and a variety of hand tools. They have even carried out various surveys for veteran trees, butterflies, reptiles and a range of flora.

"These skills have been put to use, for example in a Community BioBlitz in 2022, which led to the discovery of 75 species at Sevenoaks Common alone.

"Our achievements have included biodiversity enhancements across the sites. We've restored the lowland heathland at Bitchet, Crockham Hill and Seal Chart Commons, a habitat that's rarer than Amazonian Rainforest."

"Over 20km of access improvements have also been carried out. Walking routes and challenges have been developed to guide people through the fields, heaths, and woodlands.

"Skill sharing has been at the heart of the project, and we're proud to have delivered two 18-month apprenticeships during our time.

"On average, our volunteers have carried out 250 hours of practical conservation and access improvements every month. So far that's equivalent to £90,000 of work.

"Thanks to their hard work and dedication, we've turned the tide of neglect and reignited interest in these magnificent assets.

"In March our volunteers were deservedly recognised for all their hard work when they picked up the Highly Commended Contribution to the Environment Award at the Council's Community and Voluntary Awards. Fidelity Weston who has volunteered her time throughout the project won the overall Environmental Award for 2023."

Changes to local policing

We're excited to inform you of the new Neighbourhood Policing model, which started in early June. It includes twelve police officers on a beat team managed by Sergeant Kevin Savill and Inspector Mark Stubberfield.

There is now a District based Neighbourhood Task Force, which consists of a Sergeant, four Police officers and four Police Community Support Officers.

There is also a Child Centred Police Team comprising of a Sergeant, two Police Constables and a PCSO. They make sure young people are supported in their personal needs and diverted away from the criminal justice system.

Check your cabbie

It's important to make sure the taxi you get in is properly licensed as using an unlicensed vehicle could put you in danger.

Licensed taxi drivers must undergo rigorous background and criminal record checks as well as pass regular medical tests, while licensed vehicles have insurance checks and regular mechanical inspections.

If you're catching a cab, here are some top tips to enjoy a safe journey:

- Pre-book plan ahead and always pre-book a Private Hire Vehicle through a licensed operator
- Hail a cab You can hail a Hackney Carriage Vehicle in the street. These have roof lights but are not only London style black cabs
- Check the vehicle make sure that the vehicle is plated with Private Hire or Hackney Carriage licence plates on the rear of the vehicle
- Ask for ID If you're uncertain, ask to see the driver's ID. He or she is obliged to wear this badge and it must be visible at all times.

Local Plan survey - what you told us!



We want to thank everyone who took the time to attend one of our

drop-in sessions and events and the

600 residents and organisations who

responded to our survey.

We were particularly pleased that around half of those who took part in the survey were young people who are traditionally more difficult to reach in planning consultations. Late last year and into the New Year, we asked residents for their priorities for the new Local Plan – planning policies that will steer what can be built and where up to 2040.

The headlines from the survey showed that:

- 87% of respondents supported our proposed Vision up to 2040 – this included protecting the Green Belt, ensuring new developments support well-designed places and spaces promoting healthy communities and tackling climate change.
- 58% of respondents agreed we should focus growth in existing built up areas, speaking with our neighbouring councils to see if they can help to meet our housing need and only releasing Green Belt in exceptional circumstances.
- Respondents agreed there should be some increases in the density of new housing to help protect the Green Belt. However, they did not support building new developments at the maximum density.

We are proposing that new housing should be supported by new

infrastructure and respondents told us the four most important types of infrastructure were:

- Health and social care facilities e.g. GP surgeries and mental health services
- Providing highways and transport improvements, including changes to junctions and sustainable transport options
- Ensuring utilities such as gas, water, sewerage and broadband are upgraded to support new housing
- Providing new educational establishments such as schools, colleges and nurseries

Retail was also an important issue with over 50% of the responses referring to the need for better shopping facilities within the town centres.

Respondents' other priorities were protecting green spaces, providing better places for young people to socialise, considering safety, security and lighting in new developments and providing more and the right type of housing.
