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Getting the wheels in motion in Otford

Plans are being drawn up for a new walking, wheeling and cycling route linking Otford and Sevenoaks.

The proposed two-mile route will link the centre of Otford to Bat & Ball in Sevenoaks via shops, local attractions, amenities and two railway stations. It is intended to complement the Sevenoaks East to West route that is in the final stages of construction.

The new route is intended to provide walkers, wheelers (people on scooters, parents with prams and wheelchair users) and bike riders with safe and sustainable travel options.

It is hoped the route could also take some cars off the road, especially at busy school times, helping to reduce traffic congestion, so there's something for everyone!

Residents and businesses were asked for their views on our early ideas for the route from 6 June to 18 July 2025.

The feedback and comments are now being used to help draw up detailed designs and to bid for central Government funding to construct the route. If the project goes ahead, it will be delivered with Kent County Council.

Cllr Irene Roy, our Cabinet Member for Cleaner and Greener, says: "We want to thank everyone who took part in our survey. Their feedback has provided us with invaluable information to help move forward with this important project.

"Providing residents with accessible, safe and sustainable forms of travel is a top priority. Transport is one of the biggest contributors to carbon emissions. While it's not possible to complete every journey on a bicycle or on foot, with better facilities, more of us could leave the car at home, especially for shorter journeys."



Gearing up for new routes

We're also at the early stages of developing a walking, wheeling and cycling route between Seal and Sevenoaks and another route linking Swanley to Hextable.

Help restore the Greensands Commons!

Over the last few years, we have been working with Kent Wildlife Trust and local volunteers to restore the natural heritage of The Greensand Commons. We're now looking for new people to bolster our volunteer ranks to help maintain these special areas.

The Greensand Commons cover Bitchet Common, Fawke Common, Seal Chart and Redhill Wood, Hosey Common,



Farley Common and Crockham Hill Common.

As well as being a National landscape (previously called an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty), the Commons are known for their areas of ancient woodland and open heathland.

To help maintain the Commons, we have lots of great conservation opportunities for residents to get involved in, which will help restore important heathland and wood pasture.

The volunteer task days vary but usually revolve around enhancing biodiversity and controlling invasive species. The work can be quite physical but very rewarding.

Get ready to have your say on the Local Plan

During the autumn, you can have a say on the new Local Plan, that will guide what can be built and where up to 2042.

The Local Plan will include the broad locations for new homes along with new infrastructure to support them. It will include land for businesses and policies to ensure new developments meet high-quality design standards and mitigate the impacts of climate change.

The Local Plan will include how we intend to meet the Government's new target of 1,149 new homes to be built every year in the District, a 63% increase on the Government's previous housing target.

August Bank Holiday waste collections

Following the August Bank Holiday, on Monday 25 August, your rubbish and recycling collections will be a day later than usual until the end of the week.

Monday's collection is put back to Tuesday and collections for the rest of the week will be a day later until Saturday 30 August.

Once we have reviewed the feedback from the consultation, we will publish a final draft of the Local Plan in 2026 for examination in 2027. At this stage, a Governmentappointed planning inspector will consider whether the Local Plan is 'sound' and appropriate for the District.

The Local Plan, once adopted, will be used to determine planning applications.

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Bradbourne Lakes update

Work is progressing at pace on our £2.1 million 'Bradbourne Re-bourne project' to overhaul Bradbourne Lakes in Sevenoaks.

So far, we've carried out landscape, water, ecological, tree, historical and archaeological surveys to feed into our improvement plans.

We're also working with the Bradbourne Lakes Residents' Association and others to bring activities, old and new, to the lakes.

A planning application for the work is expected to be submitted later this summer. The improvements should begin in 2026/27, lasting around a year.

The project is being funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund along with £500,000 secured from housing developers.

There's only One You!

Health and fitness are some of the most important things in life, but it's easy to fall into bad habits.

Luckily, there is lots of free help available through our One You Healthy Lifestyle service. Whether it's changing your eating habits, exercising more or improving mental wellbeing, there's a programme for you!

One resident who decided it was time to make a change was Chris Kinghorn from Sevenoaks.

Chris, 41, used to be a chef until a complication following an operation meant he could no longer work on his feet all day. After changing his career to working at The Stag, Sevenoaks, Chris noticed he was putting on more and more weight.

On a visit to the GP, he was told he was obese and had to go on statins for his high cholesterol. This was the wake-up call Chris needed to make a change in his life. When Chris' GP suggested One You Why Weight, he was skeptical about joining the 12-week group course.

Chris says: "Coming from a chef background, I thought I knew everything about food, but this course was very informative and opened my eyes to how big the portions of food I was eating were."

"They look at your relationship with food and break it down into easy steps to follow. It has completely changed my view on food."

Chris took part in the Edenbridge programme in January 2025 and is continuing his weight loss journey with One You. He has now lost an impressive four stone, can do more exercise and feels happier and more confident in himself.

Chris adds: "This has changed my life, I never expected to lose this much



weight. It isn't a fad diet and the partnership with the leisure centre is a good incentive to help you to exercise more.

If you're thinking about signing up, go for it! It's not restrictive and you can go at your own pace. If I inspire one person to lose weight via One You, I'll be happy."

Menopause Support Group

Kent Community Health NHS Foundation Trust at Edenbridge Memorial Health Centre is now holding a monthly drop-in session for anyone going through the menopause or starting to experience menopause symptoms.

The informal sessions are a respectful and confidential space to chat with other women, share your experiences, offer mutual support and talk about ways of managing the perimenopause and the menopause.

Sherree Kempton, from the Kent Community Health NHS Foundation Trust, says: "Everyone's menopause is unique, so this session is a supportive space to help people learn and to consider their options or just chat about how they're feeling.

"This is a group led activity and whilst we don't set an agenda, we are open to covering topics that emerge and are shaped by participants."

It takes place in the Wellbeing Hub on the last Tuesday of each month between 1pm and 3pm and there is no need to book. The group is supported by staff from Kent Community Health NHS Foundation Trust, Health and Wellbeing Coaches from Sevenoaks Primary Care Network and One You Kent.

Whilst this is primarily aimed at women, men are also welcome to come along if they are seeking advice on supporting a woman through menopause.

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Council considers changes to recycling and waste collections

In recent weeks, your Councillors have been looking at a range of ideas to improve our recycling and waste collection service.

New Government legislation means that we have to offer our residents a wider range of kerbside recycling options. At the same time, we are going to take the opportunity to make the service more cost and carbon efficient.

Our 'BIG waste conversation', which surveyed residents about waste collection preferences, saw over 4,000 people take part.

Residents supported the Council's aims to reduce the environmental impact of waste collection. They also supported the introduction of wheelie bins and the proposed new recycling collections for glass, food waste and other small items.

Having considered residents' views and the new regulations, separate weekly food waste collections will begin from April 2026. We are also looking to provide residents with wheelie bins for their waste and recycling and to begin glass kerbside collections from summer 2026. Textiles and small electrical collections could begin at the same time. The green reusable recycling bags would be kept for paper and card collections, which we are now required to collect separately.

To facilitate the introduction of wheelie bins, and the additional recycling requirements, we are now considering the introduction of alternate weekly waste and recycling from summer 2026. Alternate weekly collections



would free up resources to fund these additional recycling options.

These changes would harmonise our waste service with nearby councils that could merge with us from April 2028, enabling any new unitary council to maximise cost and service efficiencies.

As In Shape went to print, Councillors were set to consider the waste service improvements at the Council meeting on 22 July 2025.

Cllr Irene Roy, our Cabinet Member for Cleaner and Greener, says: "Residents have told us to modernise our waste collection services. Most people want more recycling options and to lessen the environmental impact of the service. "Our proposals will deliver these improvements and make the service more cost-effective so we can invest in new, convenient recycling services.

"Recycling is not only good for the environment, but also the most cost-effective way of dealing with waste. But our current recycling rate is only 37%, much lower than many areas and a long way from the Government's national recycling target of 65% by 2035. Our residents acknowledge we must offer a greater range of easy-to-use recycling services to help us recycle more."

Save time and money with our tree-mendous garden waste service!

Our easy and environmentally friendly service is just the thicket, as we collect cuttings, leaves and other garden debris every two weeks, saving you trips to the tip.

Once collected, we don't moss around! Everything we take away is composted as used as a soil improver and fertilizer.

It's picked up on the same day as your rubbish and recycling is collected, and there are two options to choose from:

- An annual permit for a 240-litre bin for £60 or a 140-litre bin for £44
- 25 garden waste sacks for £27

Go plastic free!

Every year, we support Plastic Free July, a month which encourages everyone to consider their use of single use plastics.

Although July is coming to an end, it's important to be aware of our plastic use all year round.

Here's a few tips on how to cut down on your single use plastics:

Carry a reusable coffee cup or flask - It's estimated the UK uses around 4.2 billion disposable coffee cups and 2.9 billion cup lids a year! There are lots of eco-friendly options for reusable cups and they are easily available.



2 Bring a bottle – Plastic bottles are one of the most common sources of plastic pollution. Help the planet with a reusable water bottle.

Say no to plastic cutlery - The UK uses an estimated 4.3 billion pieces of disposable cutlery every year! Carry a spare from home to avoid using them.

Don't cling on to cling film - Consider alternatives like tin foil which can be recycled.

Bags for life - Don't buy new plastic bags when you shop! Take a reusable or canvas bag with you.

The Darent Valley Line runs between Swanley and Sevenoaks with stops at Eynsford, Shoreham (Kent), Otford and Bat & Ball.

Two free audio walking trails are now available to help you discover more about Shoreham Woods.



Both trails provide directions and are packed with information about local wildlife, history and more!

The Beech Walk is suitable for families with young children. A simple route of approximately one mile, which takes 30 to 60 minutes. Along the way you will meet an ancient tree and learn about some of the wildlife sounds you might hear in the woods.

The Woodpecker Walk is suitable for adults and families with older children. The route is about four miles and takes around two hours. With some steep inclines, steps and stiles, this route may be challenging for some. Along the way, you will hear how Shoreham Woods is managed, its history and wildlife.

£500k investment in leisure

Residents are benefitting from a £518,000 investment in leisure services after Everyone Active secured a five-year contract to manage three of our leisure facilities.

The agreement, which began on 1 May 2025, is funding significant upgrades at Edenbridge and Sevenoaks Leisure Centres.

Edenbridge Leisure Centre has a new group cycling studio and a modern Grab & Go food area. Upgraded gym equipment from Life Fitness and Keiser will be installed later this year, enhancing the overall fitness experience.

Meanwhile, Sevenoaks Leisure Centre is benefitting from new cutting-edge fitness equipment, as well as an exciting three-storey soft play zone for children up to the age of 12. Inspired by nearby Knole Park, the soft play features a countryside theme and includes a large slide, rock wall, ball pit and enclosed tube.

The new contract also includes the continued management of Lullingstone Park Golf Course.

The new agreement follows a successful two-year interim management arrangement and includes an option to extend for a further two years beyond the initial five-year term.

Everyone Active already manages our White Oak Leisure Centre in Swanley as part of a separate contract.

Everyone Active will continue its inclusive membership programme in the District. This includes complimentary memberships for cared-for children and care-experienced young people (via KCC family support team referrals), free access for people living with Parkinson's and their carers, plus discounted rates for NHS staff, emergency service workers, full-time carers, and Universal Credit recipients.

High street businesses get new AI support

Thanks to funding from us, a number of high street businesses across the District have been given a unique opportunity to receive support from a new AI website.

Businesses who access the 'Thriver' website are given a comprehensive 'business health-check', which becomes the framework for a comprehensive business development plan.

Thriver is like a whole team at your fingertips. It includes 12 specialist AI team members, to focus on each aspect of the business.

The support was made available for free to the first 20 businesses to register to use the service.

One of the businesses who took the opportunity to take part is NiMi Projects, a specialist Japanese homeware shop in Bank Street, Sevenoaks. Director Nicole Bargwanna found the outputs of support helpful and says: "We found Thriver useful in helping us organise the administration-side of NiMi Projects. The social media planning calendar that it created for us is a particularly useful tool and though we didn't use the content it produced for us, it was on-brand and reassured us that we were already on the right track."

Proposed new rules for beauty practitioners

Businesses and individuals who carry out non-surgical cosmetic procedures, such as Botox, dermal fillers and skin rejuvenation, are likely to need to apply for a licence in the future.

The Government plans to pass new laws to ensure only qualified professionals perform these procedures and that they are licensed by their local council.

To hold a licence, beauty practitioners will need to have relevant training and qualifications, hold the correct insurance, and have documented hygiene and safety procedures in place.

Inspections will also be carried out to ensure practitioners operate from clean and hygienic premises.

We want to stay in touch with beauty practitioners to help them prepare for the changes coming soon.

If you have a security or doorbell camera, you can sign up to Kent Police's CCTV Registry and help keep your community safe!

It's free, secure, and quick to register and your camera footage could be used to support investigations, bring criminals to justice, and make your neighbourhood a safer place to live.

The police will not have access to your cameras and can only view the location of registered cameras. They will always contact the camera owner to request footage.

women and girls, our Community Safety Partnership are encouraging all licensed premises across the District to sign up to 'Ask for Angela'.

Ask for Angela is a national scheme that helps women and girls who are feeling vulnerable on a night out to get the support they need.

When someone in a licensed premises 'asks for Angela', a trained member of staff will understand the person asking needs help and support, and will be able to respond in an appropriate, discreet way. They might call security, lead the person to a safe space, or help them leave the premises unnoticed.

It supports venues to keep their customers safe and improves perceptions of the business.

We will be providing training information and resources to any business who wishes to take part. The resource pack offered also promotes 'Ask for Andrew' for the LGBTQA+ Community.



Protect your business

We work with the Sevenoaks District Safer Towns Partnership to help prevent and reduce business crime throughout our towns.

Shops, pubs and eateries who wish to take part can join the partnership for a small fee. All members are provided with a radio that links them immediately with our CCTV control room. The radio link helps with staff safety and deterring shoplifters.

Last year, police arrested 31 shoplifters by information provided from businesses with radios. Once arrested and charged, the offenders are banned from all member shops.

There is also a secure website where members can view offender's profiles and share vital intelligence.

Male Victims Domestic Abuse Conference

On Friday 28 March, the Community Safety Partnership held a conference to highlight male victims of domestic abuse.

Domestic abuse against men happens far more often than you might expect, in both heterosexual and same sex relationships. It happens to men from all cultures and all walks of life, regardless of age or occupation. Figures suggest that as many as one in three victims of domestic abuse are male.

The morning event was well attended and looked at all aspects of domestic abuse and the effects it has on men.

The conference highlighted support for male victims and survivors of Domestic Abuse and included talks from Chief Executive of Mankind, Mark Brooks OBE, and two survivors of Domestic Abuse. We also heard about the male refuge in Kent, mental health support services and the Male Domestic Abuse Advocacy Service.

Later this year we will carry out the annual canvass to update the Electoral Register, which lists the names and address of everyone who can vote.

Every household in the District will be contacted by email or post to check if the details we hold are correct.

It's quick and easy to respond to the canvass. Please read our communication carefully and follow the instructions to make sure your details are accurate on the register.

If you are a postal voter, you may also receive an email or letter from us inviting you to reapply for your postal vote. Following a change in the law, the length of time an elector can have a postal vote for has changed from indefinitely to a maximum of up to three years.

We will be contacting everybody who is due to reapply by 31 January 2026. If we don't receive a new application, we'll write to you again later in the year.

If we contact you, it's important that you reapply for your postal vote and respond to your annual canvass communication if you need to.

Go paperless!

We can now contact you by email or phone to check your details on the Electoral Register are correct. If you would like to be contacted this way instead of by post, visit www.sevenoaks.gov.uk/elections and click 'Opt in to go paperless'.

Don't lose Swim safe!

As the weather heats up, more of us may be tempted to go for an outdoor swim. Whilst open water swimming has its benefits, there are also dangers to consider when taking a dip.

Water in lakes and ponds can be murky, hiding hazards such as rocks, logs and uneven surfaces and it can also be difficult to tell the depth. Open water is usually colder than water in a pool, so it can make you go into shock.

There are things you can do to keep safe. Here are our top five tips:

- Follow the signage if it says it's not safe to swim, don't go in
- Look around if there is no one else swimming, there may be a good reason for it
- Don't go alone make sure you have someone with you and tell others where you are going
- Check your exit make sure you can clearly see where you can exit the water. Also look for trip hazards
- **Be prepared** check the weather and, if applicable, the tide before you go and make sure you have the correct gear.

If you see someone in trouble in open water, call 999 and ask for the Fire Service. Look around for any lifesaving equipment. Depending on where you are, there might be a life ring or throwline – throw them to the person in the water and try to pull them in. It's natural to want to help the person in trouble while rescue services are on the way, but you should never enter the water to try to save someone.
